Cultural Context of This Week's Cover Art

This painting was made during the first half of the 18th century and is housed in the Kolomenskove Museum in Moscow, Russia. The 1700's to 1800's in Moscow was a great time of rebuilding. During the 17th century, a wooden palace was built for Tsar Alexey Mikhailovich in Kolomenskoye. It was known as "an eighth wonder of the world." After the dismantling of the wooden palace during the 18th century, a new four-storied palace was built on the Moskva Riverbank, near the Church of the Ascension. This, in turn, was demolished during the French invasion. What was built and remains today, is an open-air museum of wooden architecture by Peter Baranovsky in the 1920's; it is in this museum where this painting (on wood) is stored. The history of Moscow during the time this painting was created has many parallels to the story of the Rich Fool. Great emphasis was placed on reconstruction, with the majority of the left side dedicated to the building of the new barn. This is similar to the deconstruction of the wooden palace and construction of the palace of Empress Catherine during the 18th century in Moscow. The painter's distinct focus on construction in the perception of the Rich Fool parable may be due to the influences of the culture during the time period. It was a wealthy time in Russia, and the painter may have been painting this as a warning to the people, to show that wealth and bigger buildings do not equate to a God-fearing lifestyle. The emphasis on the words of God may also serve as the voice of the painter warning the people at the time of the consequences of greed.
