The miniatures depict different images, among which is a cycle of seven images of St Stephanus, the first martyr. The codex is also called 'codex Aureus', because the text is written in golden letters. The manuscript contains the four gospels of Mark, Luke, Matthew and John. Place of Production: Echternach, c. 1030. Held at Royal Library of Belgium, Brussels.
