

Florida Culture of Life Conference

Bishop William Wack would like to invite you to the annual Florida Culture of Life Conference, taking place **October 13-14th, 2023 at St. Sylvester Catholic Church.** The conference keeps with the Church's teaching that all human life has dignity and is to be protected. It will cover the Church's response to societal injustices such as the death penalty, abortion, human trafficking, and climate change. The location of the conference rotates among the seven dioceses of Florida and is jointly sponsored by the State Pro-Life Coordinating Committee and the Florida Catholic Conference. This year, it will take place at St. Sylvester Catholic Church in Navarre Florida. The conference serves to unite and strengthen and help form Catholics who wish to be better advocates for the life and dignity of all.
